Hello Everyone,

Two weeks after our trip to Woodbury, I was fortunate to spend a week at Ark Lodge for vacation, exploring areas at Woodbury that I had not been to before. There are so many treasures just waiting to be discovered out there. I checked out a small depression wetland not too far from the Lodge and found several sarvis holly (*Ilex amelanchier*) full of berries. While exploring the edge of a seepage wetland, adjacent to a xeric sandhills community, I stumbled onto quite a few southern bog buttons (*Lachnocaulon beyrichianum*). Both of these plants are listed as State Species of Concern. Although SCAN has made three tips to Woodbury in recent years, there is still much to see there and I would enjoy taking you all back to do some more exploring.

Our visit to Aiken Gopher Tortoise Heritage Preserve last month was a great trip. Late September seems to be a good time of year to visit the preserve as the weather was pleasant and there were lots of wildflowers in bloom. The scenery was quite colorful with various species of *Liatris*, *Solidago*, *Eupatorium*, *Dalea*, and *Carphephorus* in bloom. We spent most of our time in the northern portion of the preserve and did not see any gopher tortoises, but we did see some of their burrows. Many small burrows were observed in close proximity to the adult tortoise burrows and we could not decide whether they were the work young tortoises or possibly short tailed shrews. There were plenty of grasshoppers, butterflies, spiders, and bees to be seen as well. Phil dug up some pretty neat beetles along the roadway.

A thunderstorm moved in close in the early afternoon, so we decided to call it a day and head to a nearby barbeque establishment where we enjoyed some really good food and had a chance to socialize a little. I would like to thank Greg Ross for scouting and leading the trip for us.

On the 22nd of this month we will be visiting Lee State Natural Area in Lee County. This a wonderful park located on the Lynches River.

Lee State Park - Lee County October 22, 2011 10:30 A.M.

The 2839 acre Lee State Park is located in the SC sandhills on the Lynches River just east of Bishopville. I met with Laura Kirk, the Lee State Park interpretive ranger who provided me with an in depth tour of the area.

The Civilian Conservation Corps constructed the park and dug four artesian wells. The water from these wells has a low ph and provides optimum nutrition for a variety of plants. We saw several Water-spider orchids, *Habenaria repens*, in bloom next to the pond below one well.

A 4.8 mile dirt loop road is ideal for viewing wildlife. This road is a great bicycle path for those of you who wish to quietly ride in a wilderness area. On our scouting trip we saw a group of wild turkey and a deer. The road passes a picnic area known as Mulberry Island on the river. There is a picnic table, and artesian well and a chemical toilet. We spotted Cardinal flower, *Lobelia cardinalis*, in bloom along the riverbank. The park is in the flood plain of the Lynches River and the road is closed during flooding but should be accessible for our outing.

The Lynches River flows from its headwaters in Union County, NC to its confluence with the Great Pee Dee River in South Carolina. It has been designated a SC scenic river for 111 miles from the US 15 bridge just north of Lee State Park to the Great Pee Dee. However I was told that there are many strainers that impede travel in low water conditions and the ideal level is 7.5 to 9 feet. The present level (10/11/11) is about 4 feet. If you bring your boat you may wish to consider paddling up and down a bit or getting muddy. For those of you who like to camp there are moderately priced campsites at Lee State Park. Go to their website (<u>www.southcarolinaparks.com/park-finder/state-park/891.aspx</u>) for more details. We may camp if others wish to do so.

We will dine at Watford's Bar-B-Que in Bishopville. In addition to BBQ they serve seafood, spaghetti and salads. We ate there before when we went to Lynchburg Savannah HP and got no complaints.

As always bring water, lunch, insect spray, etc.

Directions: Take I-20 exit 123 near Bishopville and follow the signs north for about a mile and turn left into the park. We will meet in the parking lot next to the interpretive center. Laura Kirk will open the center for us.
